Being a Steiner school is more than just a different way of delivering a curriculum, it is about the way a teacher is in the classroom, how we run our administration and how the school and kindergarten are led. It was not a matter of democracy or a majority vote but a process to come to decisions together so they could be held and carried out together. This was the intent for a Steiner school and while societies and people have changed and more staff in various areas have made this task rather more difficult than easier as the years have gone by, the intent has to stay intact. We have therefore decided to revisit, what College meetings mean to us and where they sit within the structures, expectations and understandings of all our staff. This is not an easy task to do but also an exciting process, which is one that needs to be done regularly to ensure that the school is held and move forward with the true intent of a Steiner school.
